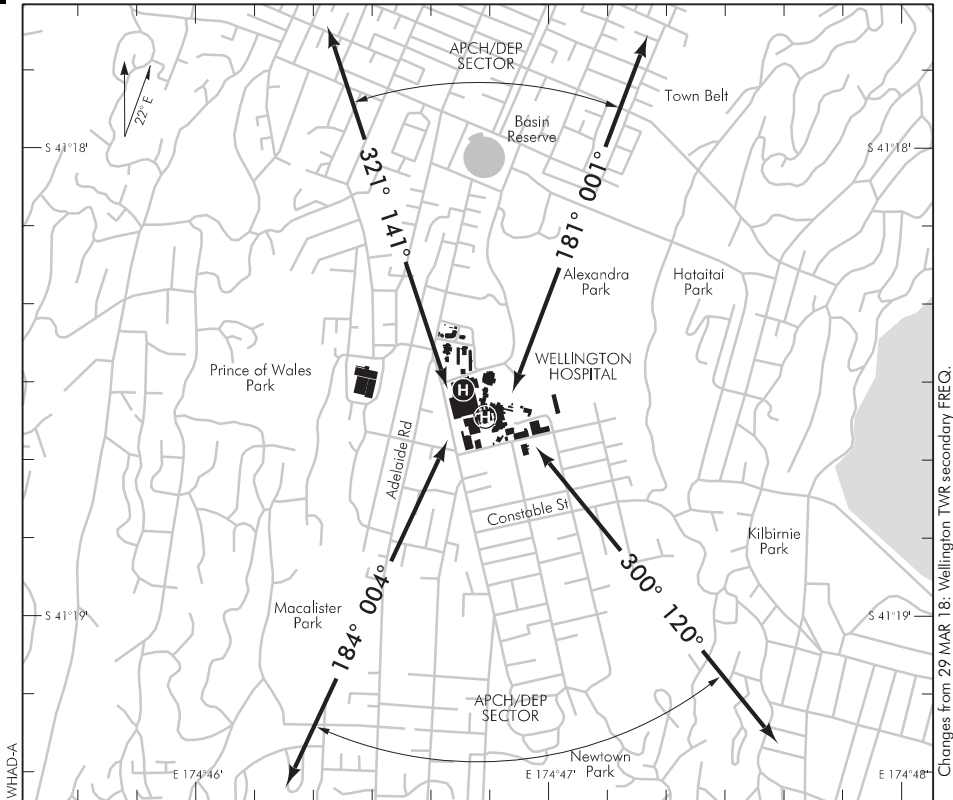

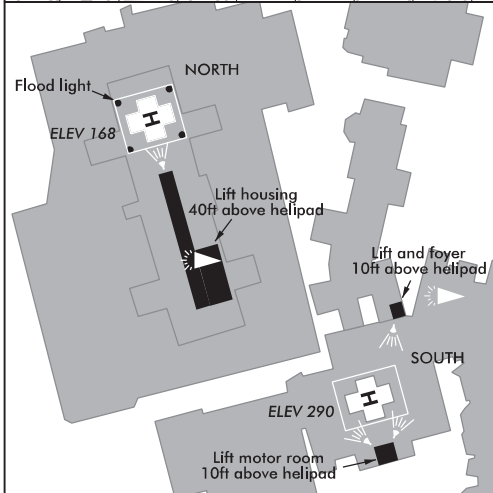

Changes from 29 MAR 18: Wellington TWR secondary FREQ.



Heliport located within Wellington CTR/C.

- Call Wellington TWR prior to lift-off
- Comply with arrival/departure procedures

CAUTION: Turbulence in wind gusts over 35kt

Heliport consists of North helipad (primary) and South helipad.

Obstacles:

North helipad: Adjacent lift buildings 40 ft above helipad surface, 100 ft south of the perimeter.

South helipad: Adjacent lift buildings 10 ft above helipad surface at both north and south perimeters.
